- A. At Risk:** 1. A significant number of children and youth with whom Child and Youth Care Counsellors work are at risk. The issues of the population of children and youth at risk include learning disabilities, ADHD and/or behaviour difficulties; fetal alcohol syndrome; depression and potential suicide; and transmission of HIV/AIDS; delinquency; street life; abuse; family crisis; poverty, etc.

2. Child and Youth Care Counsellors work in and with a variety of systems. An understanding of a work setting and the ability to collaborate with other systems is an essential aspect of CYC practice.

Evaluation:
