M: Course Objectives / Learning Outcomes

At the end of the course, the successful student should be able to demonstrate a working knowledge of, and skills in the ability to sing and hear melodic, harmonic and rhythmic elements of music.

## **N:** Course Content:

- 1. The use of the tonic sol-fa system in sight singing and dictation.
- 2. Familiarization with syllable names and corresponding pitches of major and minor scales.
- 3. Singing and identification of ascending and descending intervals up to the perfect octave.
- 4. Singing and identification of ascending and descending triads in root position, first inversion and second inversion.
- 5. Singing and writing down of simple diatonic melodies both with and without rhythm.
- 6. Singing and writing down of simple rhythmic pattern and exercises both in simple and compound meters.
